Chairman's Report

This has been a very busy year for the parish and the parish Council. As our community continues to change the Parish Council have tried to provide information and resources to residents to assist with their understanding of these changes. None bigger than the HS2 development and its impact on the community of Catcliffe.

To this end the Parish Council facilitated a consultation event with representatives from the HS2 development company. This event gave members of the community the opportunity to listen and put their questions directly. Members of the Parish Council also attended a number of drop in sessions where they could find out more about this development.

Since our last AGM Catcliffe has grown in size with numerous people now occupying the new homes being built on the Waverley site. Additional homes are now being proposed on the land behind Blue Mans Way and I'm sure the Parish Council will make representations as this development proceeds.

This year has also seen new members join the Parish Council and contribute towards the work it does on behalf of the residents of Catcliffe.

There are still a number of challenges that

the Council will have to deal with over the coming year. With cuts from central Government having a big impact on the ability of the borough Council to deliver services the Parish Council has had a number of discussions about potentially providing services on behalf of the borough to ensure that our community is kept to a high standard. We have also had discussions with Brinsworth Parish Council about running joint services such as basic street maintenance, grass and verge cutting and litter issues. It would seem as we move forward that more services may be devolved down to the local community as we all adjust to the impact of austerity.

The kiln after many years had had works carried out to ensure that the structure is safe and to prevent any further damage being caused. Although these works have been carried out the Parish Council will need to keep the pressure up to ensure that this prominent feature of our community is protected for future generations.

We have also seen works completed to the Children play area which has now seen this facility brought partially back into use with works programmed to complete this process over the next few months.

The Parish Council has also begun the important work of commissioning a report about the future of the Memorial Hall. This could potentially see large works carried out to the hall to ensure its fit for purpose to the wider community for the coming decades.

With all these works and projects being carried out by the Parish Council it's clear that there are a number of challenges that the Parish Council will have to overcome on behalf of the residents. This is important work and takes a great deal of commitment by the Parish councillors and the Clerk.

The chair has a vital role in this work liaising with the Clerk and the Council. To this end I feel it is time that the Council had some new leadership to take on these new challenges. Over the past twelve months with a combination of work and political commitments I have found it increasingly difficult to commit the time that this important role deserves.

To this end I have decided not to continue or seek reselection as chair of the Parish Council. I have enjoyed every minute of being chair over the past five years and I will of course be on hand to offer advice and assistance to the new chair. I'd like to thank all the Parish Councillors, clerks and staff past and present for their assistance and commitment over the past five years to ensuring that our community is a better place to live.
