As you're reading this edition of our newsletter the trees should be in bud and some still in blossom. The daffodils, crocuses, tulips etc have already announced the coming of spring. We are fortunate to have displays of these throughout the village. We would like to see more but despite several appeals to the community at large we cannot attract volunteers to help us manage such ventures.





With the spring comes a new budget. Our budget relies on the precept of course. We cannot escape the drastic cost of living issues that are affecting us all and we have had to make a slight increase to the precept. Thanks to prudent trimming of last year's costs and good management we feel we can maintain our standards and look forward to the challenge.

We had a recent setback when the pavilion became unusable due to a major water pipe burst. We do have insurance and work to refurbish the building is taking place.

There will more events taking place on the recreation ground this year. Many of you were delighted to welcome the alien moths from FLUX to the village recently. They will be creating an event at Easter which will be taking part in a circus tent and not to be missed. There is also a summer fete planned for the summer and details will be posted once finalised. We continue to pursue other possibilities and we welcome your suggestions.





Thanks to a Towns and Country grant from R.M.B.C. we were able to invite residents to suggest some changes to the area around the main street viaduct and roundabout. When finished we hope this will add to the ambience of the village. We have to thank R.M.B.C. Neighbourhoods and our local Ward Councillors for their lead in this matter and very much appreciate the input received from everyone.

The bookings at the hall continue to increase and this adds to our optimism for the coming year. It is an excellent facility and our users are always very complimentary.

THE PARISH COUNCIL

What do we do?

- As the first tier of local government, Catcliffe Parish Council are responsible for some of the land and activities in the area. We are responsible for:
- Poplar Way Recreation Ground with 2 football pitches, pavilion, basketball net, youth shelter and children's play area.
- Running a Playgroup
- Running a youth club
- Providing a weekly chair exercise group
- Providing kids holiday activities
- A summer fete on the recreation ground
- A Christmas event in the hall
- Regular litter pick around the area
- We run regular drop-in sessions for residents to call in to speak to someone from the parish council, ward councillors, housing, and police.
- We are sole trustee of Catcliffe Memorial Hall Fund, which runs the Memorial Hall to be rented out to groups for regular activities and private hirers for parties.

The Allotments and Bowling Green are rented out for a small fee and managed by the Allotment Society and Bowling Club respectively.

Our next project will be to look at options for the Highfield View area that has been unused since the last lot of play equipment had to be removed. We continue to research funding options for this area. We currently employ 5 part time staff to do all of this (covering approximately 50 hours per week between them all) and have 1 volunteer.

How is this paid for?

• All of our work is funded by the precept local people pay alongside their council tax, apart from the toddler group and youth club which is part funded by the lottery.

Are we part of Rotherham Borough Council?

• In a word – no. While we often work closely with Rotherham Council, we are 2 separate organisations, responsible for different things in the area so issues to do with housing, fly tipping, highways, dog fouling and flooding are unfortunately not something we can solve. We can however pass information on or point you in the right direction of who to contact. We have arranged drop-in sessions at the Memorial Hall so residents with any issues have access to parish councillors, ward councillors, Rotherham Council staff, and police.

How does the Parish Council work?

- The Parish Council is made up of 9 councillors although there are currently 4 vacancies.
- We meet once a month for a full Council Meeting to make sure our planned projects and budget are on track and to discuss any local issues.
- Every 2-3 months there are meetings for the Memorial Hall Trust.
- Other committee meetings are arranged for Events and Staffing as and when needed.

How can you help?

We were delighted to receive lottery awards grants for a couple of very special projects. These grants pay for the group leaders salaries and allow members to attend for free.



Clir WENDY GREEN:

You need commitment but it doesn't take up a huge amount of your time. But it's a great feeling working together to make where you live a better place.

Cllr TONY BAYLISS:

I have been a councillor for just over a year. I wanted to contribute to the area I live in and see if we could create some community events. In particular I wanted to set up a youth club so that the young had a place to go to be safe and talk freely once a week. Getting involved with the monthly meetings and organising events for the community is very rewarding. The success of the toddler group and hopefully the youth club gives me enormous pride. I really do hope our team will soon be back at full strength. Based on my own experiences I can guarantee a warm welcome if you join us. In my time in the village the community spirit has been excellent but there is more to be done.

Clir GARRY MARSH:

I have been a parish councillor since 2015, 3 years as chairman 2018 to 2021. I currently serve as vice chairman.

I've lived in Catcliffe for over 30 years. Prior to joining the parish council I was chair of Catcliffe Flood Action Group working with a number of agencies to help protect our village from flooding. My career background is in IT and project management.




