From The Chair.

We're now in Autumn but basking in an Indian summer which would have been more welcome in the normal summer. The poor weather caused the cancellation of our summer fun day unfortunately. But we still have the raffle prizes and everyone can compete for them at our Christmas Fayre. We have a full house of stalls and we are able to provide refreshments on a donation basis. We do intend to be rather early with the Christmas decorations and hope the traditionalists forgive us.

Having taken the step to become sole trustee of the hall we can report that it seems to be a good move. Bookings are up, our regular groups have stayed with us and we've managed to remain within our budget. We continue to work hard in an effort to take the next step and actually swell our funds.

With the long term in mind, we took the decision to clear the Highfield View playground of hazardous materials. The next step is to make it available for new play equipment. We are looking into funding options as we don't want to burden residents with a huge increase in the precept in the middle of the cost of living crisis.

There was good news on the financial front when we managed to maintain our lottery funding for the children's playgroup. This will enable us to improve the facilities at the hall for the youngsters in the form of a safe outdoor play area and garden. Unfortunately our youth club initiative did not get the attendance we required to justify further grant funding. Our social and exercise group is going strong on Thursdays and we are able to offer this for free.

We're doing OK with pitch bookings on the recreation ground, well we can't allocate any more in fact. We're lucky to have Tina ruling the roost down there and she makes it an enviable facility.

There is also the continued shortage of councillors. We should have 9 councillors and at most meetings these days we have just the 3 turn up. We do our best but the difficulty is plainly obvious. So we're on the lookout for community minded residents who could bring their skills and commitment to improve matters in and around the village. We particularly appeal to younger adults who could give us a wider aspect of knowledge and enthusiasm as to what the community needs.

There are a couple of projects instigated by R.M.B.C. running late and we'll keep on prompting for a definite outcome. Our web site and Facebook page are regularly updated and we welcome your feedback. The village belongs to us all and we should be working together.



We are a small self-funding registered Charity formed in 1985 to provide low-cost Oxygen Therapy for people dealing with Multiple Sclerosis. Thirty-Eight years later and we are still a small, self-funding charity but now we provide Oxygen Therapy to **everyone** over the age of 18 who is dealing with **ANY** life changing illness including MS, other neurological conditions, cancer and Long COVID.

Oxygen Therapy O_2T consists of breathing medical oxygen, through an individual mask either in a pressure-controlled chamber (ours seats 6) or in one of our '2 Normal Pressure 'outlets. Oxygen Therapy increases the amount of available Oxygen absorbed into the blood supply, circulated and used throughout the body to help healing.

Increasing Oxygen levels in the blood:- enables greater healing and repair to nerve and tissue damage including bone and muscle. It encourages the growth of new blood vessels and improves the blood

supply to all areas of the body, which reduces swelling and speeds up recovery time to any damaged areas. It can also lessen the effects of aggressive medical treatments and surgery. It enhances the body's defence mechanisms which increases its ability to fight infection and kill bacteria. Demand for Oxygen Therapy is higher than ever.



Additional Therapies: Neuro-physiotherapy, osteopathy, acupuncture, reflexology and much more.

You don't need to be a MS sufferer. There are no restrictions on the number of appointments attended, members can access all our therapies and can 'cherry pick' all the help they need when they need it.

We receive no Government or NHS funding so **EVERY PENNY** needed to keep the Centre open and operational and our therapies available has to be raised by us at the Centre. This is an enormous task. For 2023 we need to raise **£147,670**, with our therapies basic costs alone being **£40,000+**. We are grateful for any help received.

EVERY PENNY donated or gifted to us makes a positive difference in people's lives.

The door is always open for anyone to have a look round and talk to us. We're very friendly and you may even get cake. We also have our own charity shop which is stocked with quality merchandise and with Christmas approaching there are several bargains to be had.

CATCLIFFE ALLOTMENTS ASSOCIATION

The move to create an allotment site began in 2010 when the first people moved onto the site which, at that time, was totally overcome with weeds and debris and it didn't have any form of plots marked out whatsoever.



A small core of interested, local people began the slow process of measuring and marking the plots out and cutting down and destroying the continual weeds. This core of people set the Association into motion – they had been given the opportunity by Catcliffe Parish Council to develop the land into something worthwhile. They worked very hard, not only on the plots themselves, but also in forming the Association with a set of rules and a Constitution and bank account. Slowly their hard work paid reward and they were able to take over responsibility for the running of the site with their own finances based on membership rents. Catcliffe Parish Council still remain the landlord to the site as the land belongs to them and not to RMBC.

The Association became a thriving community of people with similar interests, and belonging to various ages and backgrounds. Plot holders become an automatic member of the Association when they pay their annual subscriptions in October of each year.

Some of the earlier plot holders have remained on site, but there has always been a turnover of people interested in the Allotments. If there is no availability on request for an allotment we do hold a waiting list of names. If you belong in the village, or the surrounding local area, and you are interested – please contact the Secretary via CPC website.



This whole area of land known as The Allotments is situated at the end of Station Road, Catcliffe past the last row of houses and it still has a valid part to

play in Catcliffe and the surrounding areas. After all the hard work involved over the last 13 years, it really would be a shame for the interest in the Association not to continue. However, it can only continue with the support and interest from our surrounding area. Long may it continue.
